Curiousity

This week at Assembly we focussed on the idea that 'Curiousity is the key to Creativity'.

The importance of creativity is an idea that surfaces from time to time, and last year we talked about Steve Jobs, the co-founder of Apple and how he creatively connected ideas in a way that others did not.

The latest trigger for me was a book I recently read, about the life of Leonardo da Vinci. Some of you may have read it too.

He is famous of course for being a painter, even though he probably only ever completed less than 30 paintings in his lifetime! Actually, he was curious about everything, and he was curious just for the sake of it. He would write things in his notebook like: describe the tongue of a woodpecker; why is the sky blue?; and, why do people yawn?

Then he would go into the detail and through observation, experiment, debate and reading he would form answers to these types of questions.

And so it was, that he was actually a painter, a sculptor, an architect, a musician, an engineer, an inventor, an anatomist, a geologist, a botanist and I suspect some other ...ists to boot!

By being CURIOUS about all sorts of things, and by connecting Art and Science, Leonardo formed an incredible understanding of the world in which he lived.

So, the message to our students is that we should always encourage and value CURIOUSITY, even if it doesn't seem relevant at the present moment. Because, 'Curousity is the key to Creativity."

Notice from the Southland District Health Board

You may be aware that currently there is an outbreak of measles in Canterbury. If students are attending a sports tournament or function in Canterbury it is prudent that they are all up to date with their measles vaccinations. This means having had 2 documented MMR vaccines. The best protection against measles is the free measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine. You need 2 doses of measles-containing vaccine to be fully immunised.

New Zealanders born from 1 January 1969 are eligible for free MMR vaccinations. If you were born before the measles vaccine became available in 1969, you are considered at lower risk because you were probably exposed to measles as a child. People aged 10 to 29 years are at greatest risk of catching measles, as they're the group least likely to have been fully immunised as children.

If you're unsure of your vaccination status you can check your Well Child Tamariki Ora or Plunket book, or contact your general practice. If you can't find your records, the Ministry of Health recommends you get vaccinated anyway – it's free, and there is no harm in having an extra dose of the vaccine. It's never too late to get up to date with your immunisations. By being immunised, you will not only be protecting yourself and your family – you'll also stop the disease spreading in your community.

- 2 doses are necessary to get the best protection.
- Immunisation (with 2 measles vaccinations) is very important for older children and adults.

Payment for Sporting Events:

When your child registers interest in attending a sporting event, there is sometimes expenses involved with this (entry fees, transport costs, etc). These expenses must be paid before the student attends the event. The cost of an event is always listed on the parent consent form sent home. They have three options of how to pay these expenses:

Cash (given to the sports co-ordinator or Teacher in Charge)

Eftpos at Reception (then give the receipt to appropriate person in charge)

Internet Banking—you must ensure you make reference to what it is for and the student's name.

These expenses for such extra-curricular activities may not be put onto student accounts. However, if your school account is in credit please let the person in charge of the event know so it can be arranged with the Accounts Administrator for payment to be allocated to the event.

If these expenses are not paid before the event your child may miss out on attending.

Similarly, subs for winter sports such as netball and basketball will be put onto student accounts,





School Trustee Elections 2019

Every three years, parents, caregivers, and people from the wider community can be nominated for election on a school board.

The board's primary focus is to ensure ongoing improvement in student achievement outcomes for all students.

A Board of Trustees is made up of 5 elected parent representatives, the Rector, a Staff representative as well as a Student representative (only in schools with students above Year 9). In addition, other Trustees can be co-opted to assist with board with specific projects.

All Trustees have an equal voice, equal vote, equal accountability, and equal standing.
