
We take every opportunity to demonstrate and articulate our family-based values, which are centred around 'Courtesy, Effort, and Responsibility.'

The Junior School Years 9-10

All junior students are required to study a broad balanced education to meet the requirements of the National Curriculum.

The major aims in the junior school are to:

- Provide students with a sound grounding in subjects
- Equip students with a strong foundation in the learning of attitude and skills
- Give students the opportunity to explore a wide range of subject areas

Compulsory subjects in Years 9 and 10 will include English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education and Health. Class placements are mostly in broad banded classes which are based on students' Numeracy and Literacy abilities.

Accelerate classes in Years 9 and 10 are based on academic results.

The Learning Hub

A primary trained teacher is available at all times to assist students who require extra help with their learning.

There is an opportunity for all students to receive one-on-one help with a particular learning skill or curriculum area. The Learning Hub offers students intensive, specialised support or their learning needs, regardless of their year level.











The Senior School Years 11-13

Students in Years 11, 12 and 13 study towards the external qualifications with the New Zealand Qualifications Authority at NCEA Level 1, 2 and 3 as well as Scholarship. Gore High School is fully accredited to award credits in all conventional subjects and we have a very wide ranging accreditation to teach and assess vocational units.

The major aims in the senior school are to:

- Provide students a qualification in the subjects they are studying for
- Equip students for the transition to the post-school world of employment or further education
- Provide each student with a relevant course of study that matches the individuals' strengths and abilities

The junior subjects continue on to NCEA Level 1 qualification in Year 11.

Social Studies in the junior school provides the foundation for NCEA Level 1 in History, Geography and Economics.

Students in Years 12 and 13 are offered a very wide choice of subjects, taught by specialist teachers. This is a definite advantage of a larger secondary school.

Class placement in Years 11 to 13 is largely based on each student's choice of option subjects which are selected from a wide range of courses offered. Minimum entry requirements exist for Years 12 and 13 subjects. These are explained in the option booklets.

Distance Learning, Gateway, and a Tertiary High School programme enable students to gain part of their qualification in the workplace.


Our Career Pathways Department employ specialist staff who help students prepare for a smooth transition into the world beyond school.

The House System A School Tradition

There are four Houses:

- Hunter

Each House has a House Leader, a student House Captain and Deputy House Captain.

Inter-House competitions are held regularly during the year. At present, Houses compete in Athletics, Swimming, Cross Country, and the Prefects' Variety Concert. This House structure is a tradition that has been in place for 80 years.

If students have a family connection with a House, they may request to be in the particular House.

Student Boarding at Rosmini House

Gore High School has a partnership with neighbouring school St Peter's College. Students from Gore High School and St Peter's College are able to board together at Rosmini House, a co-educational boarding house that caters for boys and girls from years 7 - 13. Rosmini House is more than just a place to sleep; it provides a safe, family-orientated environment where students develop academically and socially.
